Recent Granville Galaxy Lessons

We play safely on the asphalt

At school we have several asphalt covered areas that students can play on. Sometimes, children can be injured when they run in these areas and consequently fall over. This can be very dangerous and distressing. This lesson reminds students of the appropriate types of activities to be played in the asphalt area. The lesson also encourages students to be safe at all times.



We know what to do in the calm areas of our school

At school we have identified that sometimes children need or want to spend some of their play times completing quiet activities.

For this reason, we have

established an area in the library

that is open during lunch times. In

this area students are able to play

board games, read and use some of

the other library resources.

It is a time and space available for students who would sometimes rather play inside with their friends than run around in the playground.

This lesson reminds students of the importance of this area and demonstrates appropriate behaviours for quiet spaces.

We use the toilets appropriately

We realise that this is a sensitive issue but there are times when students behave inappropriately in the school toilets. This lessons encourages students to understand the value of our school toilets and the need to be respectful of others.

Some of the expected behaviours include:

- We use the toilets and leave the area promptly
- We wash our hands
- We use the toilets only for appropriate reasons
- We keep the area clean by flushing toilets, throwing rubbish in the bin, turning off taps, only placing toilet paper in the toilet
- 'Share the voice space' by using inside voices in and around the toilets



We walk safely in the toilets

This lesson teaches students about the importance of being safe when in the stairwells. Students will be instructed to:

- Walk on the left
- Walk using one step at a time
- Hold the hand rail
- Walk at a safe pace
- Keep a safe distance between each person



Students will be asked to practise these important skills at each time they use a stairwell in the school. Please encourage your child to practise these skills at home also.
