## New Granville Galaxy Lessons: Anti-Bullying

At Granville Public School we promote an inclusive environment, where diversity is affirmed and differences are respected. Quality education is provided for students to meet their learning needs in a secure, ordered and effective environment. The focus of quality education is for students to learn and grow with confidence.

Granville Public School's Anti-Bullying Plan, is a key component of our 2009 Discipline and Welfare Policy and Program. Embedded in the plan is the expectation that all students have the right to assume that they will spend their school day free from the fear of bullying, harassment and intimidation. Teachers, students, parents, caregivers and members of the community have a responsibility to work together to address bullying. The lesson below is the first lesson in the series of three lessons.

## What is Bullying?

In the first lesson of the series, students were encouraged to construct a definition of the term 'bullying'. Students were supported to view bullying as:

- Intentional and repeated behaviour by an individual or group
- Behaviour that can cause distress, hurt or undue pressure.

Through class discussion, brainstorming and teacher support, students were helped to understand that for an incident to be identified as bullying, it must adhere to this criteria. This means that not every incident of student aggression or intimidation should be viewed as bullying.



Teachers also explained to students that bullying can occur in a variety of forms. Bullying can be:

- Physical (hitting, spitting, tripping)

Upcoming lessons will help students to understand how they can stop bullying.



The 2011 Premier's Reading Challenge is underway and continues until September 1.

Granville Public School has 52 students who have registered and started logging their reading.

Already we have 7 students who have completed the challenge. Congratulations to Zoe, Hugo and Kardelen in Year 2, Stanley in Year 3, Olivia, Kusum and Felicity in Year 5.

All students entering and successfully completing the Premier's Reading Challenge will receive an official PRC certificate and their names will appear on the PRC Honour Roll.

Our first intake of Selective students will be Year 7 2012.


