Term 3, Week 4 Anti - bullying

At Granville Public School we promote an inclusive environment, where diversity is affirmed and differences are respected. Quality education is provided for students to meet their learning needs in a secure, ordered and effective environment. The focus of quality education is for students to learn and grow with confidence.

Granville Public School's Anti-Bullying Plan, is a key component of our Discipline and Welfare Policy and Program. Embedded in the plan is the expectation that all students have the right to assume that they will spend their school day free from the fear of bullying, harassment and intimidation. Teachers, students, parents, caregivers and members of the community have a responsibility to work together to address bullying.

Students have already participated in a series of anti-bulling lessons, through the Granville Galaxy Program, to address the issue of bullying. The lessons focus on identifying bullying behaviour and strategies for dealing with bullying. Teachers frequently refer to these lessons to remind student of the key ideas.

## **Granville Galaxy Peer Lessons**

Towards the end of Term 3 our Year 6 students will be helping to teach our Granville Galaxy lessons. Each week the students will be assigned to a class of younger students to deliver the lessons based on the weekly focus.

Next week our Year 6 students will be involved in a two day workshop to develop the skills to work with their peers and supported to understand the lesson content.

We anticipate that peer teaching of the Granville Galaxy lessons will be enjoyable and beneficial for all students.
