RAMADAN AND EID AL-FITR

On behalf of Mrs Barry and all the staff at Granville Public School, I would like to wish all the Muslim families at our school a Happy and Blessed Ramadan and Eid al- Fitr.

Muslims believe that during the month of Ramadan, Allah revealed the first verses of the Qur'an, the holy book of Islam to the Prophet Mohammad.

For more than a billion Muslims around the world, Ramadan is a "month of blessing" marked by prayer, fasting, and charity. It focuses on self-sacrifice and devotion to Allah (God).

Muslims practise *sawm*, or fasting, for the entire month of Ramadan. This means that they may eat or drink nothing, including water, while the sun shines. Fasting is one of the Five Pillars (duties) of Islam.

Fasting serves many purposes for the Muslim people. While they are hungry and thirsty, Muslims are reminded of the suffering of the poor. Fasting is also an opportunity to practise self-control and to cleanse the body and mind.

Ramadan ends with the festival of Eid al-Fitr, literally the "Festival of Breaking the Fast". People go to the mosques to pray, dress in their finest clothes, decorate their homes with lights and decorations, give treats to children and enjoy visits with friends and family.

A sense of generosity and gratitude colours these festivities. Although charity and good deeds are always important in Islam, they have special significance at the end of Ramadan. As the month draws to a close, Muslims are obligated to share their blessings by feeding the poor and making contributions to mosques.

What's happening in the Preschool?

Last term, Miss Cathy attended a Munch and Move workshop which is a program run by NSW Health. It is a fun, play based program that supports the healthy development of young children from birth to five years of age attending early childhood services across NSW.

Munch and Move has six key messages, which are:

- Encourage and support breastfeeding;
- Choose water as a drink;
- Eat more fruit and vegetables;
- Choose healthier snacks;
- Get active each day; and
- Turn off the television and computer and get active.

We will be looking at and talking to our preschoolers about a few of these key "Munch" messages throughout the year, especially choosing water as a drink, eating more fruit and vegetables and choosing healthier snacks, as well as setting up our own vegetable garden.

In addition we will be providing our families with information about these key messages so please look out for them in your child's news pocket.

We will also be incorporating a "Move" session during our outdoor play focussing on Fundamental Movement Skills (FMS) that involves movement using different parts of the body such as feet, legs, trunk, arms, hands and head.

Research suggests that the earlier FMS are introduced through play and exploration, the more likely the children will be to engage in physical

activity throughout their lives d e v e l o p i n g competence and confidence.



BOOK WEEK

In week 6 Granville Public School is promoting the importance of literature in children's lives by celebrating Book Week. In accordance with Book Week's theme "Champions Read" the students will each be given a home reading log, in which they will record the amount of books read between 16/08/12 and 21/08/12. Books read in class will also be recorded and the class with the most amount of books read in total will win a "week of spoiling".

On Thursday 23 August a Book Character Parade will take place from 9:15 am with students dressed as their own character or students have the opportunity to design their own character and costume. Also on this day there will be a Book Fair from 11am -12pm.
