Dear Parents,

Congratulations to our wonderful Year 5 students who took the initiative and accepted nomination to stand as student leaders for 2013. Although the school year is starting to wind down, there are still 5 weeks of school left. All the wonderful mums who work in the uniform shop are volunteers and as we have children still in infants we want to be with them on the first few days back at school.


